

Going Deeper – Daily

Additional questions that may help guide your daily observations and applications included in *The Whole Story Devotional Guide*

Week 9:

- Job 1: Observe – List what Job had and how it was taken from him. Why did God allow Job to be tested? What was Job's initial response.
Apply – What is my first response when something is taken from me or lost? How can my response be more like Job's?
- Job 2: Observe – What does God allow Satan to do next? How do Job's friends respond?
Apply – Has there been a time when someone in your family or a friend just needed you to be with them? Was it difficult to just be silent?
- Job 32: Observe – Elihu replies to Job's defense of himself. In contrast to Job's friends' initial silence and subsequent confrontations, Elihu seems intent on sharing his thoughts. Why?
Apply – Job has endured quite a lot – but has yet to curse God as his friends have urged him throughout his time of trial. What lessons can I learn from Job's response?
- Job 38: Observe – The Lord speaks to Job – Write a summary outline of the wonders of the Lord.
Apply – The Lord is great – how can I praise Him today?
- Job 40: Observe – Job contrasts his insignificance with God's greatness. Make notes about what the Lord describes as Behemoth.
Apply – The Lord asks: "Can you thunder with a voice like His [the Lord's]?" (verse 9, CSB). Respond.
- Job 41-42: Observe – How does Job respond to the Lord? List all the ways that Job is restored.
Apply – Is there a restoration needed in my life? How can I pray?
